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IMPORTANT POINTS TO NOTE

- Admission of FYUGP Major/Minor Courses into the college on MERIT BASIS.
- Students intending to have Major/Minor Course in a particular subject shall have minimum of 45% marks in that subject in the last qualifying examination.
- Admission shall be offered as per the reservation policy of the Govt.
- 20% of the total seat capacity shall be reserved for students coming through CUET.
- Fee waiver shall be strictly considered for those students only who can produce income certificate of their parents issued by the concerned Circle Officer.
- Regular attendance in class is compulsory.
- Fulfillment of 75% of attendance of classes held (lectures delivered) by the students in each subject is compulsory as per new curriculum under NEP of BU.
- Evaluation of internal marks for class attendance as per specified ranges.
- Sessional Examination Tests for all Major & Minor classes (Arts & Commerce) will be conducted by each department and attendance of students in the Tests is compulsory.
- Unit Tests for all classes shall be held in due course as per academic calendar.
- Gap Certificate for students seeking admission who have passed the qualifying examination earlier than the current year should be produced at the time of admission from any of the following whichever is applicable.
 - (a) Medical Certificate from the Govt. Medical & Health Officer on genuine medical grounds.
 - (b) Gap Certificate from SDC/BDO/Chairman, M.B. on genuine financial constraints.
- Production of the following documents in original at the time of admission by a candidate is compulsory.
 - (a) Mark sheet and Admit Card of H.S.S.L.C. (10+2) and last qualifying examination.
 - (b) Pass Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended.
 - (c) Caste Certificate from the competent authority wherever necessary.

It is hardly half a kilometer away from D.C. Office and

District Centre of Chirang District towards its north-west and about one and half kilometer towards the west from Indian Oil Corporation (Bongaigaon Refinery), Dhaligaon. A beautiful Eco-Park with boating facilities is coming up just behind the college. In a short span of 21 (Twenty One) years, the college has developed into a full fledged Institution of Higher Learning with a Proven Academic Excellence with its own examination centre of Bodoland University.

LIBRARY



he college has a well furnished Library with a reading room attached to it. The Library has a stock of about Ten Thousand books of various disciplines. The stock consists of academic text books, references, encyclopedias, QR Code - previous question papers etc. Besides these it also provides Journals, periodicals, newspapers, Employment News, e-resources etc. for the benefit of the readers. Students are always advised to make the best use of the college Library to expand their mental horizon as well as their knowledge to meet the needs of their normal academic courses and make themselves fit for next higher classes and also for various

competitive exams. Teachers and other faculty members are also advised to avail of the library facilities in the best manner. Reprographics (xeroxing) facility for the students is expected soon.

The library has been automated with Koha softwere and RFID technology for systematic knowledge management and ease the use of different resources of the library. The library provide following services - Circulation, Self Issue and Return, OPAC, Reading Room Facility, Periodic, News Paper including Employment News, E-Resources (N-List), Reference and Information and Open Access e-resources.

Library Membership: Library membership is compulsory for all the students. Faculty and office staff of the college can also avail the services of the Library. Research scholars of the neighbouring institutions are also welcomed to access the library facility in order to support their Research activities. As per the prescribed Library rules, faculty members are allowed to borrow 5 books for a month. Students of General course shall be issued 2 books and Major course 3 books for 15 days. Office staff will be issued 2 books for one month.

READING ROOM

he college has a well furnished reading room attached to the college library where number of students can sit at a time and do the needful study. Books that are kept in the Reference Books, Periodicals and Journals can be utilised by the students in the best possible manner during their study at the reading room. However separate reading room has also been arranged for the teachers. Both students and teachers are expected to utilise the reading room facilities in the desired manner.

DISCIPLINE

The college firmly believes in discipline and act upon the principles of discipline. Discipline and punctuality are the only way of success. It is mandatory for each and every students to follow the prescribed disciplines and decorum of the college.

- II. Students having 75% or more class attendance shall only be allowed to appear in their respective final Semester examinations.
- III. Ragging is "human rights abuse in essence". All forms of ragging in the College campus are prohibited. Strong disciplinary action will be taken if any one is found to be involved directly or indirectly in ragging.
- IV. Students must carry valid identity cards in the College hours.
- V. Consumption of Gutkha, Pan masala, Smoking or any other intoxicants is strictly prohibitted in the College campus.
- vi. Violation of rules, irregular attendance, showing discourtesy to teachers and staff members in any form, adoption of unfair means during examination, delinquent behaviour in the College campus or outside, etc. are some of the offences which may invite disciplinary action like termination of scholarship, compulsory transfer and even expulsion from the College.

STUDENTS' IDENTITY CARD

Students' are issued the college Identity Card annualy. Old Identity Card is to be surrendered by each student at the end of every academic session for renewal. It is mandatory for all the students to carry the College Identity Card during class hours and at the time of disbursement of their Scholarships. The College authority reserves the right to issue a duplicate identity card in case of loss/damage of the original card on payment of necessary fees by the students.

STUDENTS' AID FUND

With a view to assist the poor and meritorious students of the college, a Students' Aid Fund has been created by taking a minimum contribution of fees from the students at the time of admission. The college authority after careful scruitiny of all the applications submitted by the students arrives at those, as to who shall be given the assistance. This however, depends on the availability of the fund position of the college.

GAMES AND SPORTS



The college provides opportunities for students to excel in various sporting events. The college has its own cricket and football ground where various sporting events are held from time to time like the one during the college week. The College also offers opportunities for adventure sports like Rock Climbing, River Rafting and High Altitude Trekking Expedition. It

has its own Adventure circle by the name of Upendra Nath Brahma College Adventure circle. Interested students are charged a meagre amount of fees in extra for their participation whenever required. The adventure circle of the college has already conducted some remarkable sporting events like, rock climbing and bouldering at Bhubaneswar hill, River rafting at Manas river, High altitude Trekking expedition in Darjeeling and Sikkim, etc. The circle arranges for a Trekking expedition to different places of India from time to time.

EXTRA CURRICULUM & MOTIVATIONAL ACTIVITIES

The college provides scope for various extra-curricular activities for the greater interests of the students community. It is hoped that these kind of activities will promote the zeal of togetherness and community services among the students. Recently the College has opened its own **NSS Unit** and began its operational activities. It tries to generate awareness on certain pertinent issues relating to our society among the students community. The college has **NCC (Army) Unit** under **7th Assam Battalion, Dhubri** since September 2022. Every year first semester students are given opportunity to be recruited through physical and written test process. This **NCC** facilitates for both boys and girls students to acquire knowledge and training regarding Army, Paramilitary Forces and Assam Police. Besides this, an Educational Tour cum Excursion Trip to different places of India is organised annually in the month of January. Students are advised to take part in extra-curricular activities during his/her student life in the college.

Condition for Continuing Fee Waiver Scheme

The Students whose parents income is below 2 Lac. per annum must produce income certificate issued by concerned circle officer to continue with fee waiver scheme as per the policy of the Government of Assam but to avail this opportunities the students must fulfill the following conditions.

- 1. Attendance must be 75% and above.
- 2. There should not have any back paper in the pervious semester/semesters examination.

Rewards for Attendance

Students shall be awarded with the following marks for their attendance in the class

if the attendance is 96% to 100% then 5 Marks
If the attendance is 91% to 95% then 4 Marks
If the attendance is 86% to 90% then 3 Marks
If the attendance is 81% to 85% then 2 Marks
If the attendance is 75% to 80% then 1 Marks

If the attendance is less than 75% then 0 Marks will be offered to the Students and will not be not allowed to appear in the examination.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- 3. Admission procedure is governed by the College admission rule. Principal's decision is final in matters of admission.

 - (iii) Caste Certificate (wherever required).

 - (vi) Income certificate issued by Circle Officer.
 - (vii) H.S. Registration Certificate.
- Names of selected candidates will be displayed on the college website and notice board after scrutiny for admission. The date of admission will be notified as per the Samarth Notification issued by the Govt. of Assam. Registration forms will be issued to admitted students after the admission is over. The filled up registration forms must be submitted within seven days from the date of issue of the registration form.
